

- ☐ Photo crawl board To make, take photos of the children in your group, print out on regular paper and glue to a large sheet of posterboard.
- Taking the time to make a material like this one is time well spent when you can use it multiple times. This experience combine a movement activity with receptive language skills and new vocabulary about friends. At the same time, infants will build fine and gross motor skills as they explore the photos on the board.
- Place the photo board on the floor and sit with the infant near it. Watch to see what the infant does. As the infant touches a picture of a child on the board, talk about that child. You might want to share his/her name, what he/she looks like, etc. As the infant moves around, he/she will learn more about the children in your group.

ADAPTATION FOR YOUR ENTIRE GROUP: If desired, you can take this idea and use it with your entire group by taking photos of each child in your group, printing out on 8½" x 11" paper, sliding each photo into a clear sheet protector and then using blue painter's tape to attach to the floor. Then the children can move in different ways as they move from face to face. Add a little music, and when the music stops, each child must find a friend's face to touch and name.
